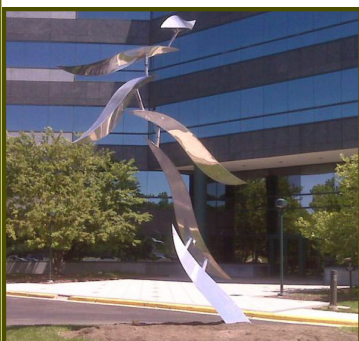

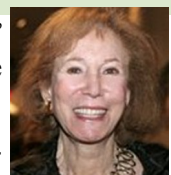

ARBORETUM LAKES SCULPTURE

New Orleans artist Lin Emery created the beautiful sculpture “Aerial” located between the 901 and 1001 Warrenville Road buildings. The sculpture measures h: 18’ by orbit: 18’.

Lin seeks to capture the energy inherent in nature in her kinetic sculptures. Not only does her iconography rely on natural shapes, but it is the forces of nature such as wind or water that set her sculptures in motion. Movement, or kinetic activity, whose aim is to express harmonic patterns visually, is the central element for Emery. Her sculptures employ a system of bearing assemblies that she developed in order to manipulate the elements so that they move freely and randomly in space. The highly polished surfaces of her welded aluminum sculptures invite a dialogue between the industrial character of their construction and the organic connotations that the works evoke.

NEW SWAN PAIR

A new pair of *Mute Swans* are now occupying the Arboretum Lakes pond between the 801 & 901 buildings.



Use caution if you must be near the swans nesting grounds as the male can be strongly territorial during this season. Swans typically lay four to eight eggs that take approximately one month to hatch. Within 24-hours of hatching, the cygnets leave the nest and are able to swim and feed.

EARTH DAY EVENT

Genesis Electronics collected more than 40,000 pounds of **E-Waste** last year with the help of their many clients. This means that 40,000 pounds of highly hazardous materials did not end up in a landfill and instead were de-manufactured, parts of value were re-introduced into manufacturing stream and the rest were sent to certified facilities for metal and other materials recovery. Genesis adheres to a strict 0% landfill policy.

For one day only, Thursday, April 26th there will be a Genesis box located on each of the building loading docks for you to drop off your **E-Waste** items. SEVERE WEATHER SAFETY

With the advent of Spring, the weather can turn dangerous. In general there are two types of unusual weather conditions for which extraordinary precautions should be taken, severe thunderstorms and tornados.

When a severe thunderstorm approaches, the local weather service will issue advisories predicting areas of probable severe thunderstorm activity and the estimated duration of such activity.

A tornado warning is a notification by the National Weather Service confirming a tornado sighting and location. The weather service will announce the approximate time of the detection and direction of movement. Winds can be 75 MPH or greater.

In the event of a severe storm or tornado, the following guidelines should be observed:

1. Move away from the exterior walls and any windows of the building to a corridor, washroom, stairwell or elevator lobby. If unable to leave an exterior office, seek protection under a desk.
2. As you move, try to close the doors of rooms that have windows. Also, be sure the door to your suite is closed tightly, but NOT locked.
3. Stairwells are considered safe. If too crowded, move down to a lower level for shelter. **DO NOT USE THE ELEVATORS.**
4. Do NOT leave the building.
5. Once in a protected area, shield yourself by kneeling on the floor and putting your head as close to your lap as possible.
6. Do not use the telephone to get information or advice. Once the weather has subsided, report any damage or storm related leaks to the Management Office at 630.963.1151.
7. **STAY CALM!**
